01. Review

Review the administrative system in all of state agencies and government institutions



02. Recommend

Provide recommendations to the head of state agencies and government institutions regarding administrative system areas that are prone to corruption



03. Reform

Report to the President, the Parliament and the Supreme Audit Board, when the KPK's recommendations were disregarded.

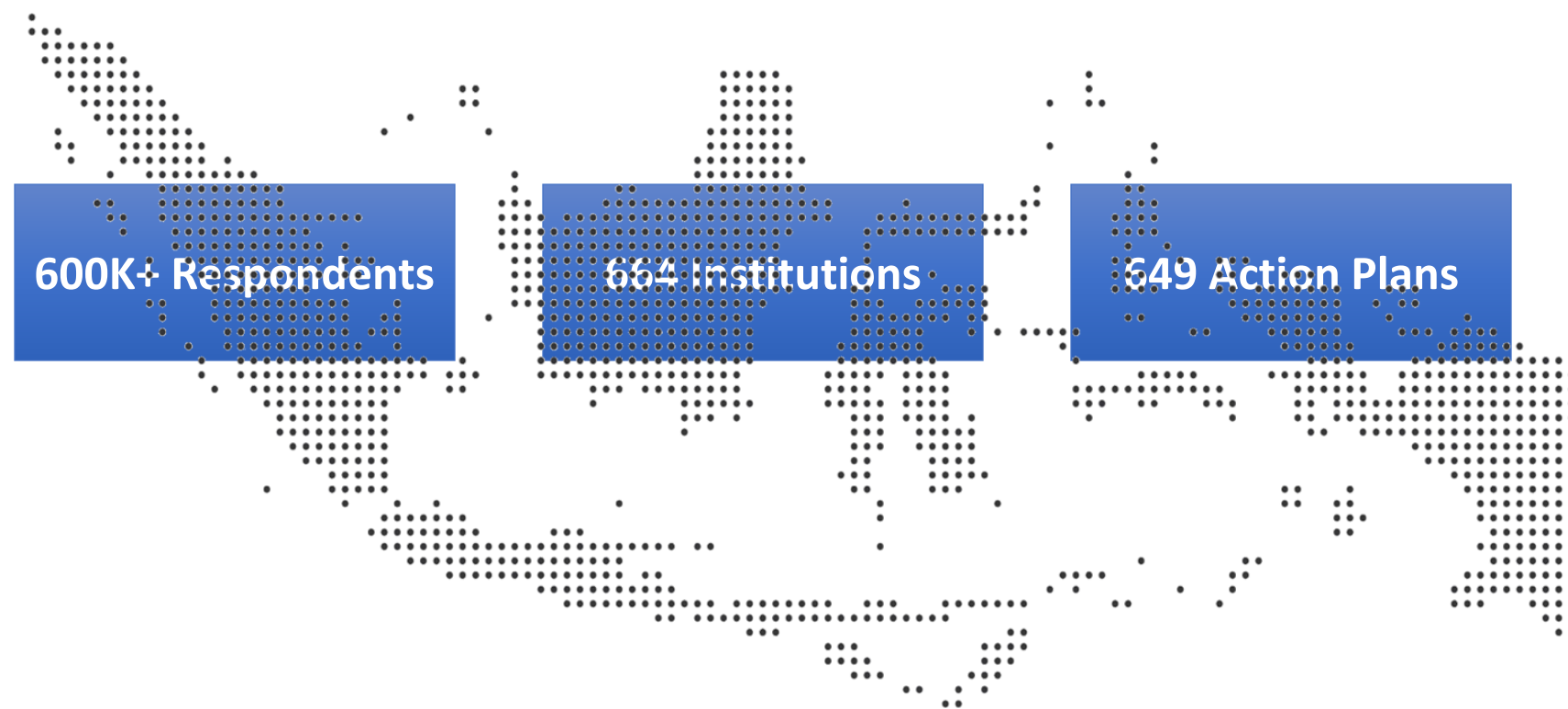
THE ROLE OF MONITORING DIRECTORATE

- Monitoring works quietly yet drives real change.
- Provides evidence-based insights that help shift systems and strengthen integrity without direct confrontation.
- System Review (Qualitative) & Survey (Quantitative);
- Beyond conducting reviews, the follow-up actions embedded to ensure real change

Integrity Assessment Survey: An Intervention for Risk Awareness and Reform

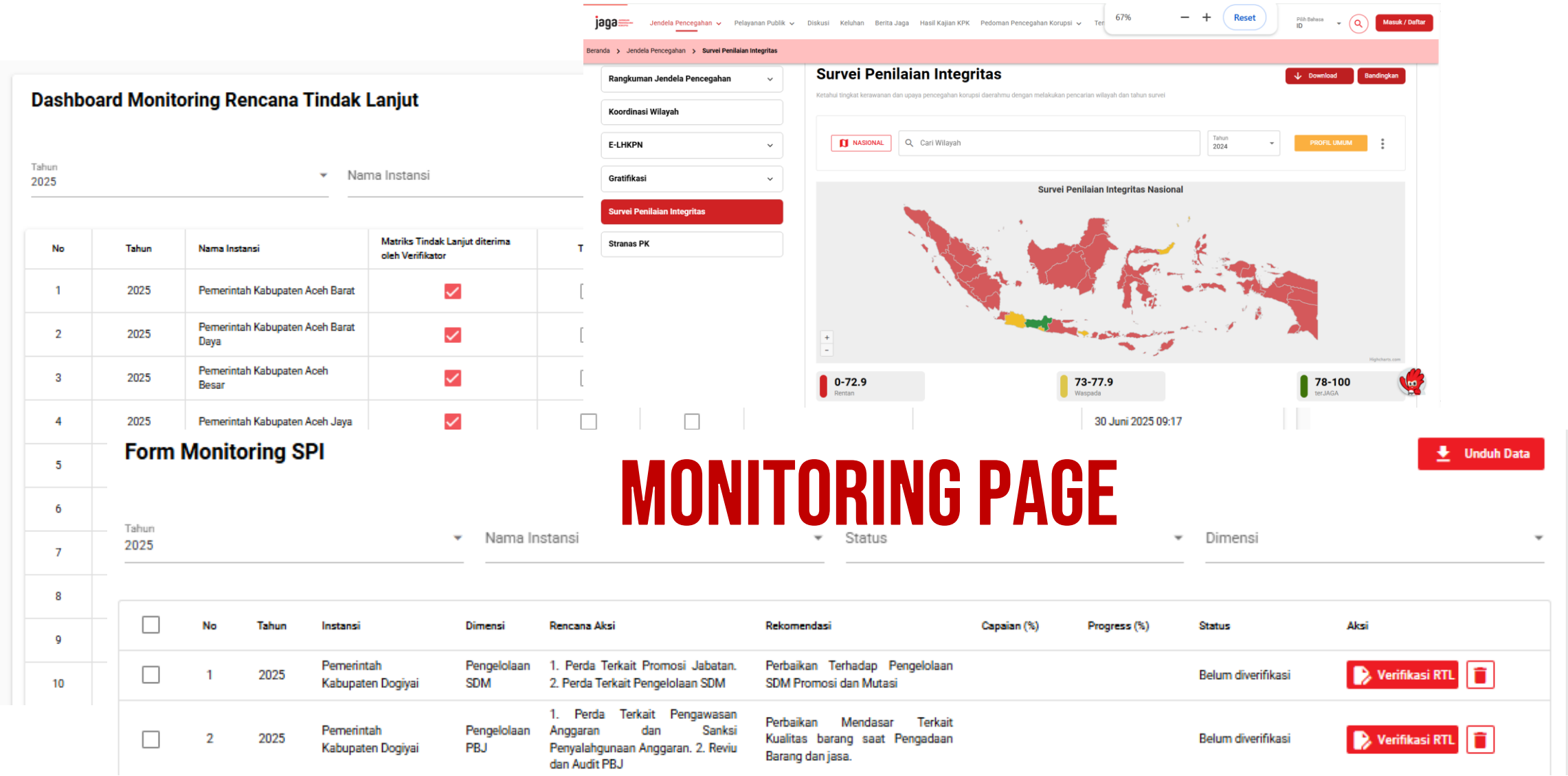


- Massive engagement: over 600,000 respondents across 664 institutions (ministries, agencies, SOEs, and local governments).
- From awareness to action: findings translated into 649 institutional action plans.
- Learning for the future: enables evidence-based evaluation of which prevention efforts work, and which do not.
- A systemic tool: not only measuring integrity, but also driving reforms through collective action.

SUBMISSION PAGE where Ministries, Agencies and Local Government submit their action plans



- KPK has developed an **integrated monitoring platform** to: Share results with both the **public and government institutions**.
- Facilitate the **submission and follow-up of action plans** by ministries, agencies, and local governments.
- Ensure **transparency, accountability, and collaborative reform**.
- This platform serves as a **bridge between evidence, policy, and collective action**.

- Monitoring as an integrity tool bridging the policy–practice gap.
- Lessons learned: effective monitoring requires transparency, collaboration, and consistency.
- Looking ahead:
 - Scaling up monitoring practices in Asia-Pacific.
 - Strengthening peer learning and sharing of methodologies.
 - Commitment of KPK: to further develop monitoring as a pillar of anti-corruption and governance reform.
